THURSDAY Cave presentation- Alexandra Cave.

difference and similarities in the caves.

Cathedral Cave- the most recently opened cave at Naracoorte. In groups to workshop and plan a

tour / presentation on this cave.

Final dinner in Naracoorte.

FRIDAY Adventure caving for those who have some time.
